EEG measures the electrical activity that is recorded from many different standard sites on the scalp according to the international (10 to 20) electrode placement system. It is a useful diagnostic test in evaluating epilepsy. This policy addresses the use of EEG in the diagnostic evaluation of headache.

A minimum of 20 minutes of artifact-free EEG activity, not including calibrations, is required. At least 3 different montages must be recorded*, including at least one bipolar, and one referential montage for a minimum of one minute each. The montages must be complete and appropriate to demonstrate abnormality.

Ambulatory EEG monitoring is a diagnostic procedure for patients in whom a seizure diathesis is suspected but not defined by history, physical or resting EEG. Ambulatory EEG can be utilized in the differential diagnosis of syncope and transient ischemic attacks if not elucidated by conventional studies.
