Iridescence: and the Birds-of-Paradise. Iridescent feathers appear black or dull one moment, then flash into glittering color as light hits them at just the right angle. The colors are produced as the feather’s microscopic structure reflects some colors while eliminating others.

The results showed that the birds required on average about four pecks to catch an “iridescent” dot, compared to about 2.5 pecks to catch the solid-colored dot. Furthermore, when the birds missed, they did so by a larger margin than when trying to catch the color-changing dots.

Iridescence (also known as goniochromism) is the phenomenon of certain surfaces that appear to gradually change color as the angle of view or the angle of illumination changes. Examples of iridescence include soap bubbles, feathers, butterfly wings and seashell nacre, as well as certain minerals.It is often created by structural coloration (microstructures that interfere with light).

Iridescence is a visual characteristic attributed to surfaces that change in colour with viewing angle. The term derives from the Latin and Greek ‘iris’, meaning rainbow, and also refers to Greek goddess Iris, who is the personification of the rainbow and a messenger to the gods (Barnhart & Steinmetz 1988).

Inside the Secret World of Iridescent Animals | Discover ...

The brilliant iridescent colours of the peacock’s tail feathers are created by structural coloration, as first noted by Isaac Newton and Robert Hooke. In living creatures, structural coloration is the production of colour by microscopically structured surfaces fine enough to interfere with visible light, sometimes in combination with pigments.

Groove-billed Ani: Medium-sized black bird with iridescent blue and green overtones, with a very long tail (half the length of the bird). Bill is huge, with arched ridge and narrow grooves. Feeds on insects, ticks, spiders, lizards, fruits, berries and seeds. Flies low to the ground.
